NOTICE TO STUDENTS: TUITION LOAN APPLICATIONS FOR 2026 - 16 JUNE 2026

The School wishes to inform all students in the **Advocates Training Programme (ATP) Class of 2026** and **Second Year Diploma in Law (Paralegal Training Programme) students (2026 Cohort)** that the School has set aside a **limited tuition support fund** to assist financially needy students with the payment of tuition fees.

The facility is administered by the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) on behalf of the Kenya School of Law through the KSL Tuition Loan Scheme. Eligible students are encouraged to apply for this loan facility within the application period indicated below.

Application Period and Eligibility: The application portal is open until **26th June 2026**, and no applications will be accepted after the closing date. Applications are invited from students in the **Advocates Training Programme (ATP) Class of 2026** and **Second Year Diploma in Law (Paralegal Training Programme) Students – 2026 Cohort**.

Purpose of the Loan: The School Tuition Loan is intended to support **needy students** in meeting their tuition fee obligations. As the funds available are limited, applicants are advised that meeting the eligibility requirements does not automatically guarantee an award.

Application Process: Applications for the School Tuition Loan are processed online through the HELB Student Portal. Applicants should register using their National ID and a valid email address, log in and select the “Loan Application” option, then search for and select the Kenya School of Law Tuition Loan for the 2026 academic year. After completing and submitting the online application, applicants must print and sign the application form, obtain the necessary certification and supporting documentation, and submit one hard copy to the Kenya School of Law, Karen Campus, within the application period.

Important Notice

- The tuition loan fund is limited and will be awarded subject to the availability of funds and successful assessment of need.
- Students are encouraged to apply as early as possible within the application window.
- Incomplete applications or applications submitted after **26th June 2026** may not be considered.
