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### LAUNCH OF E-LEARNING PROGRAMME FOR ATP STUDENTS

Following a review and evaluation of the Pilot E-learning Project for the Advocates Training Programme conducted by the School between 9<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2020, it has been concluded that it is possible to offer the programme through e-learning while maintaining the quality of training. Taking into account the directives by the Government on containment of the spread of the novel coronavirus (Covid-19), it has therefore been decided that ATP tuition for the 2020/2021 class shall resume on the e-learning platform with effect from 3<sup>rd</sup> August, 2020.

Consequently, all ATP students in the 2020/2021 academic year are requested to register for the e-learning programme by completing the registration form available on the School website. The registration commences on 9<sup>th</sup> July and closes on 16<sup>th</sup> July, 2020.

The School recognises the challenges faced by some students in terms of affordability of internet services. In this regard, the School is engaging licensed mobile telephone service providers for partnership in offering some modest support to ATP students by way of data bundles.

The School notes that it will be difficult to resume face-to-face classes in the near future and has therefore taken this decision so as to enable the students complete their tuition and take the Bar examination at the earliest possible time. Regrettably therefore, those students who do not sign up for the e-learning will be deemed to have deferred their studies to a later date.

Further details regarding the revised calendar and duration of e-learning will be released in due course.
