ABOUT THE COURSE

Legal Innovation & Technology for Legal Professionals is a course that has been conceptualised and developed through collaboration between the Kenya School of Law and Utatuzi Centre. The Kenya School of Law is a public institution established by law to offer, on behalf of the Government of Kenya, training in Law and related disciplines. *Utatuzi Center* is a global platform situated in Kenya providing legal-technology solutions, with a focus on online dispute resolution, innovation in law, and legal technologies.

TRAINING FOCUS

The aim of the course is to create legal-tech savvy legal professionals who are cognizant of the various legal innovations and legal technologies that will aid in their various daily legal activities as well as strategically positioning themselves in the modern digital era.

The training is relevant to legal practitioners in private and public practice, judicial officers, arbitrators, mediators, court clerks and paralegals. The training will focus on the following areas:

- Online dispute resolution;
- Legal tools and technology for legal professionals;
- Crash course on ICT cyber security for legal professionals;
- Emerging legal technologies, including AI, block chain, big data, and automation;
- Web assets and content management for legal professionals;
- Digital strategic positioning for legal professionals.

By the end of the course the participant will be equipped to-

- a) Know how disputes can be effectively managed, handled and resolved online through various ADR strategies;
- b) Advise their respective organizations on the various legal tools, technologies, and resources that are critical for modern lawyering;

- c) Apply various legal technologies, including AI, block chain, big data, and automation;
- d) Explore how the legal profession and market for legal services operate online and how one can create a market share;
- e) Explain the effects of technology and disruption on the traditional model of Legal Services;
- f) Know the various cyber threats attached to law practice such as ransomware, viruses, and social engineering associated with technology and internet usage, and how to avoid them.
