1. SAFETY AND HEALTH OF THE PARTICIPANTS

Cognizant of the risk posed by the Covid-19 pandemic, the Kenya School of Law has taken all measures to comply with the Government directives on the handling of the pandemic to assure our participants of their safety and health during the training.

2. ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Kenya School of Law is a premier academic public institution mandated under the Kenya School of Law Act No. 26 of 2012 to deal with practical teaching and training in the area of law for and on behalf of the Government of Kenya. The School organizes and conducts training for the acquisition and enhancement of legal knowledge and professional skills development not only for legal professionals, but also for other professionals.

3. ABOUT THE COURSE

The Data Protection Act, No. 24 of 2019, came to effect on 25th November, 2019. The Act is meant to give effect to Article 31(c) and (d) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 on the right to privacy. In addition to establishing the Office of the Data Protection Commissioner, the Act makes provision for the regulation of the processing of personal data. It provides for the rights of data subjects and obligations of data controllers and processors. The Act creates rights and obligations which must be understood, not only by data processors or controllers, but also by individuals and organisations. Further, they

must be well equipped with the relevant data protection knowledge in order to implement and manage an effective data protection compliance framework.

The fact that the legislation is new means that there is a need to train many people who will be subject to the law.

4. COURSE OBJECTIVES

Cognizant of the impact that the Act has on organisations, government, including state corporations and businesses, the Kenya School of Law has rolled out this training to create awareness of the data protection law, including the principles that have to be adhered to in order to keep data accurate, safe, secure and lawful, and to provide a deeper practical understanding on how to comply with the new regulatory regime on data protection.

The training focuses on the ICT sector granted that data protection significantly involves ICT. The issues of software privacy and privacy requirements for example need to be implemented in compliance with the laws and guidelines governing data privacy.

5. COURSE CONTENT

Among the topics to be covered are;

- ✓ the roles and responsibilities of different players in the data protection regime, including data controllers, data processors, data protection officers and the Office of the Data Protection Commissioner;
- global developments in data protection;
- ✓ implementing and managing a data protection compliance framework.

6. COURSE DELIVERY

The training will be conducted by a highly experienced team of seasoned data protection experts who are practitioners and professors in the field.

The training will be conducted through interactive lectures, assignments and plenary discussions to ensure that it is participatory, interactive and practical.

7. INTENDED PARTICIPANTS

The course is open to both legal and non-legal professionals. It is particularly intended for:

- i. ICT professionals, legal professionals and other data protection consultants, to be equipped with the relevant practical knowledge in order to advise their clients appropriately on data protection.
- Administrators, practitioners and government officials, both national and county, who are responsible for ensuring their organisations, businesses, corporations, and institutions comply with data protection laws.
- iii. Representatives of institutions, professional and regulatory bodies associated with data protection.

8. CERTIFICATION AND EVALUATION

A certificate will be issued to the participant who attends the entire course.

9. YOUR INVESTMENT

The course is offered at a special rate of KShs. 95,000/- (The fee includes *tuition fees, taxes, registration fees, course materials, stationery, lunch and refreshments*).
